Introduction of Jacqui

Jacqui: thank you to us, as a board, for addressing our misstep and grateful we are willing to visit this issue and talk about implicit bias training as it is a great place to start. The IAFN was involved to a certain degree as well as the social justice committee and Christina had met with the previous board and had some conversations. The suggestion was training. IAFN education will do the implicit bias training 4 times a year and it is live training. New director of RCC may be a great idea come and talk to us about it, keep it in state. Jacqui would also offer UW Milwaukee, Dr. Lucy Mkandawire-Valhmy. She could be a great resource as well as Dr. Jeneile Luebke (post graduate student at Madison) and the last one that could really be relevant Dr. Ashley Ruiz (relationship between SANE nurse and patient's - black). Her findings were profound. The results of her dissertation could be very relevant to share with our WI IAFN. The HERSA grant that Jacqui wrote for SANE A training and lack of resources in rural Wisconsin. St. Croix Valley SART's program was discussed as needing more in rural and American Indian resources. Our goal of being able to give options of care to American Indian patients, which is especially important for all communities of color. Ask for abstracts and presentations. Ask our members to do the work, we have a very thoughtful, educated and kind membership. Community/Academic relationships are very important to our work. We need more studies in this state, example of photographs was brought up. It would be great do the research on things like this.

Questions about Social Justice committee, they are going to be charged by the IAFN to figure out the next steps. Jen Pierce Weeks hopes to have a PowerPoint with statistics and rationales. ANA has some implicit bio training, and it mirrors what we are doing (IAFN). Case Scenario and all get to give input into the scenario. It is an interactive process. Jacqui believes we can do our own and Jacqui can send us some templates. Sometimes we need to go outside of nursing to learn this work and advocacy is a great resource for this because they have a different relationship with the patient then we do. Instead of saying triggered, say a memory that came up for me. Jacqui said she would be willing to submit an abstract. Jill will be willing to reach out to the director of RCC (Dana). Dana may be busy but we could take any recommendations she has.
